Breaking Records, Contributing to Sisal in Tanga & Introducing the Kwaraguru Estate Manager

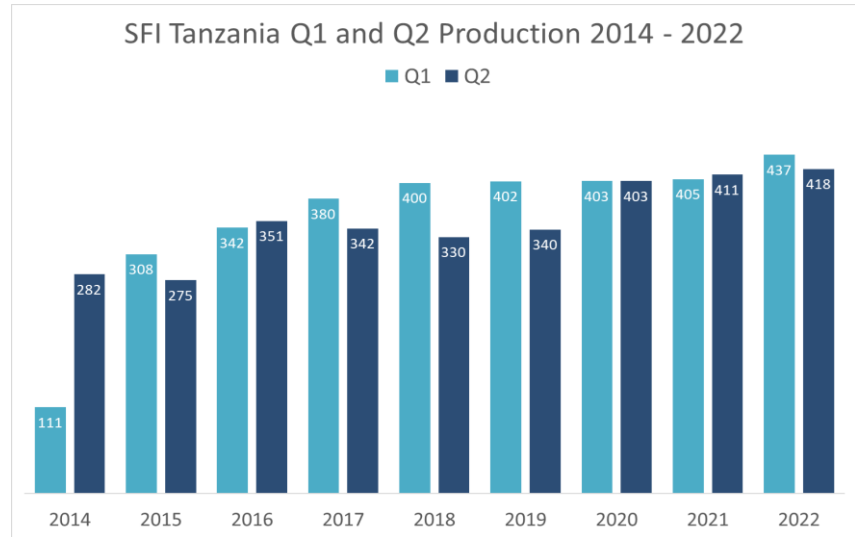

SFI Tanzania is proud to be part of re-establishing Tanga region as a world class sisal producer by donating a total of **987,800** sisal suckers to sisal out growers during 2022 that will result in 297 ha single row and 148 ha double row planting. SFI Tanzania conducted training to 163 employees during Q2. Training included Polio vaccination training, Industrial First Aid Training to our safety representatives through OSHA, Health and Safety training to production employees and the safe handling of chemicals.

Training is conducted annually to employees and surrounding communities regarding hygiene, fire safety, rights of communities through social monitoring. The company continues to build new houses and renovate high-risk structures.

Environment

SFI Tanzania conducts annual water testing, fumigation of water bodies to curb malaria infections as well as Annual Environmental Auditing for forestry and sisal. The company continues to promote environmental awareness through training and the management of a zero-hunting policy on the estates. Indigenous trees are protected on SFI Tanzania estates. This allows species such as Colobus monkeys to be protected.
