Kapok seeds have been sown in polybags as well as Dalbergia Melanoxylon and Albizia versicolor. SFI Tanzania continues to manage 164 teak outgrowers since inception of the project in 2015.



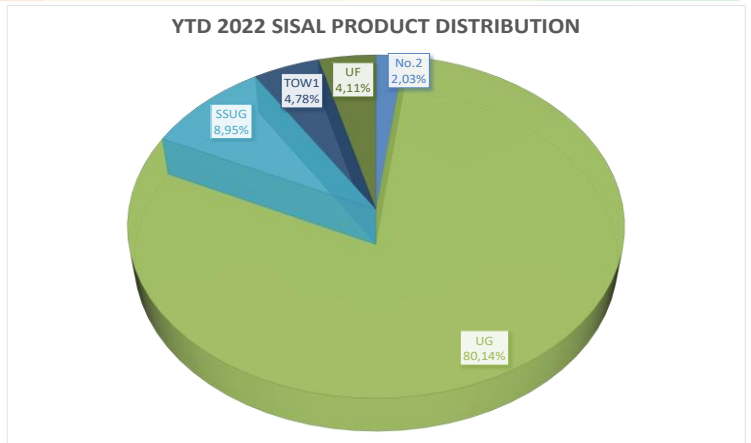

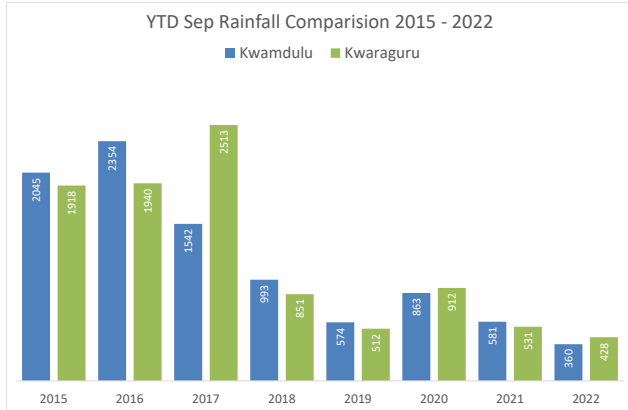
Renovations

Social and Environment

Social

SFI Tanzania promotes health and safety of its employees and implementing OSHA principles in safeguarding the environment. Training is conducted annually to employees and surrounding communities regarding hygiene, fire safety, rights of communities through social monitoring. The company continues to build new houses and renovate high-risk structures.

Environmental Compliance

SFI Tanzania conducts annual water testing, fumigation of water bodies to curb malaria infections as well as Annual Environmental Auditing for forestry and sisal. The company continues to promote environmental awareness through training and the management of a zero-hunting policy on the estates. Indigenous trees are protected on SFI Tanzania estates. This allows species such as Colobus monkeys to be protected.
